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**Educational Needs**

The National Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants census in 2014 estimated 1.4% of the 101,977 licensed PAs were practicing urology. The State of the Urology Workforce published by AUA as of May 2015 confirmed the aging of the urologic workforce reporting more than half of the 11,703 identified practicing urologists, nearly 23 percent are aged 65 years or older. As we have known for years, the work force shortage can be supplemented by physician assistants. In order to fill this need, physician assistants in urology should understand the conditions leading to urology workforce issues and be able to illustrate to stake holders the conditions that optimize productivity.

We will focus several talks on urologic malignancies. Management of urologic malignancies includes multiple modalities that require that physician assistants to understand current issues regarding diagnosis, treatment choices as well as management once treatment has been completed. Because physician assistants are often the source of patient education regarding management of the long term complications of cancer treatment, it is also necessary to provide them with clinically relevant information regarding patient survivorship.

With the rapid growth of integrating physician assistants into urology practices comes the need to provide training in urologic procedures including female and male sexual dysfunction, cystoscopy, urodynamic testing, pessary fitting, neuromodulation.

**Educational Objectives**

1. Recognize the wide array of available prostate cancer testing choices and learn how to use the correct test for each individual patient circumstance.
2. Identify common pediatric genital anomalies and associated treatments.
3. Describe the process of diagnosing patients with presumed interstitial cystitis.
4. Recognize the impact of ICD-10 on documentation and practice in Urology.
5. Illustrate female bladder dysfunction procedures/surgical interventions.
6. Explain the principles and rationale of testosterone replacement therapy (TRT).
7. Identify current controversies surrounding testosterone replacement therapy.
8. Assess LUTS due to BPH with or without erectile dysfunction.
9. Interpret and explain the appropriate diagnosis, prevention and treatment of castration resistant prostate cancer.
10. Describe the AUA guidelines for management of Urologic Malignancies.
11. Explain simplified Urodynamics: How does the bladder fill, how does it empty, is the urethra competent during the filling and voiding?
12. Identify the tests and procedures used in the diagnosis of bladder cancer.
13. Describe the cystectomy surgical techniques and urinary diversion.
14. Plan Erectile Dysfunction surgical management.
15. Define and rationalize antibiotic stewardship.
16. Practice radiologic evaluation of flank pain and hematuria.
17. Identify possible causes of male infertility.
18. Describe indications for cystoscopy and for using cystoscopic guidance for catheter placement.
19. Describe the proper evaluation and work up when making the diagnosis of Peyronie's Disease.
20. Describe the evaluation for a patient with female sexual dysfunction.
21. Describe basic urodynamic diagnoses.

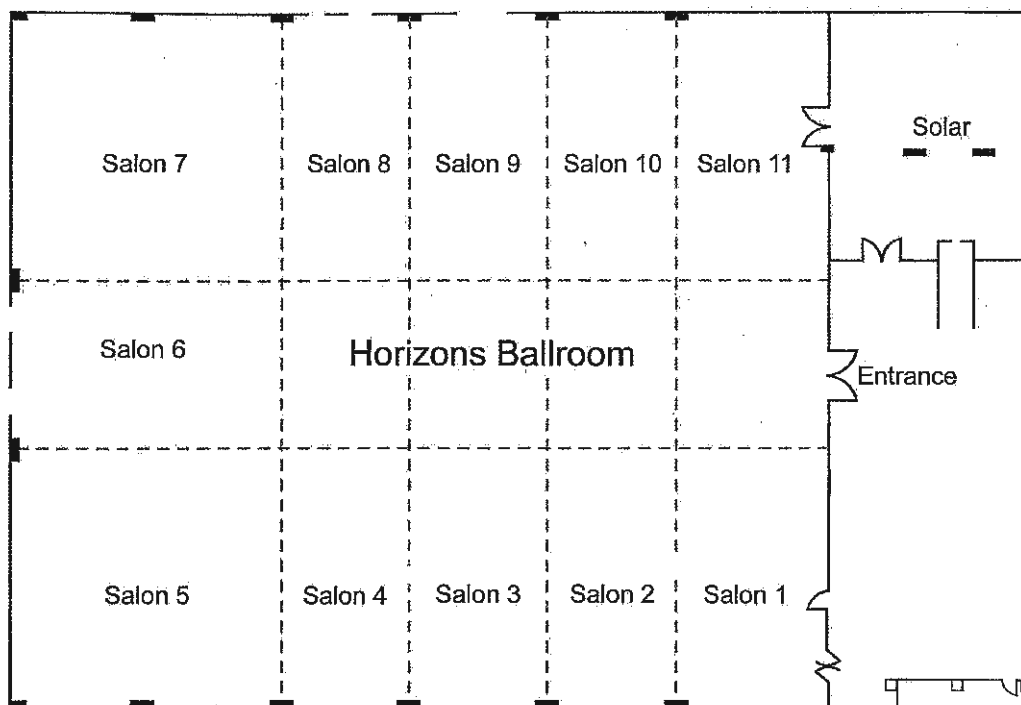

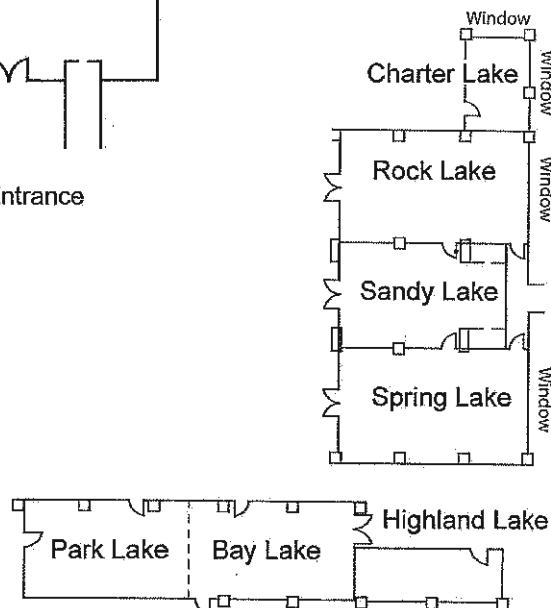

**John Andrich, PA-C**

Mr. Andrich is a medical provider for Dr. Vipul Patel and the Center for Urologic Cancer in Celebration, Florida. He has been a part of the robotic surgery team for more than two years and has helped continue the excellence Center for Urologic Cancer strives for on a daily basis. He earned his bachelor's degree in biology at the University of Central Florida in 2009 and his master's degree in medical sciences, physician assistant studies at Nova Southeastern University in 2013.

Currently, Mr. Andrich is a member of the American Urological Association, the American Academy of Physician Assistants, the Florida Academy of Physician Assistants, and the Florida Urological Society.

**Jeff Brady MD, FACS**

Dr. Brady is a board-certified urologist born in Syracuse, New York. He received his undergraduate degree from the Jesuit run LeMoyne College and was awarded the William F.J. Ryan Medal in Junior Pure Science and played division I baseball. He obtained his medical degree at the State University of New York (SUNY) Upstate at Syracuse, graduating with multiple honors. This was followed by his urology residency at the University of Miami. Dr. Brady pursued a fellowship in adult and pediatric genitourinary reconstruction at the internationally renowned Devine-Jordan Center in Norfolk, Virginia under Dr. Gerald Jordan. He is the only fellowship-trained physician in urologic reconstructive surgery in central Florida and one of the most experienced in the state. He has been with the same practice in Orlando, Florida, since completing his fellowship in 2000.

Dr. Brady has particular expertise related to men's health including urethral stricture disease, male urinary incontinence (male sling or artificial urinary sphincters), erectile dysfunction (ED- penile prosthesis), hormone replacement therapy (testosterone) and disorders of penile curvature (congenital curvature of the penis and Peyronie's disease).

**Tamara Dickinson, RN, CURN, CCCN, BCIA-PMDB**

Ms. Dickinson is a nationally and internationally recognized authority in urodynamics, incontinence, voiding dysfunction, and pelvic floor dysfunction. Ms. Dickinson is board certified in urology nursing and continence nursing and is certified in biofeedback for pelvic muscle dysfunction.

With 15 years in the field, Ms. Dickinson is experienced in pelvic floor therapy including biofeedback and neurogenic voiding dysfunction, as well as other pelvic floor and continence therapies such as sacral neuromodulation and pessaries. She is a frequent national presenter on these topics.

Mr. Dougherty has been practicing as a physician assistant in the urology department at UT Southwestern Medical Center since 2012. in a urology practice. Ken recently became the Founding Program Director of the Meharry Medical College Physician Assistant Program.

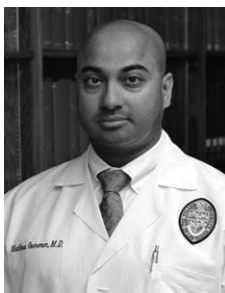
